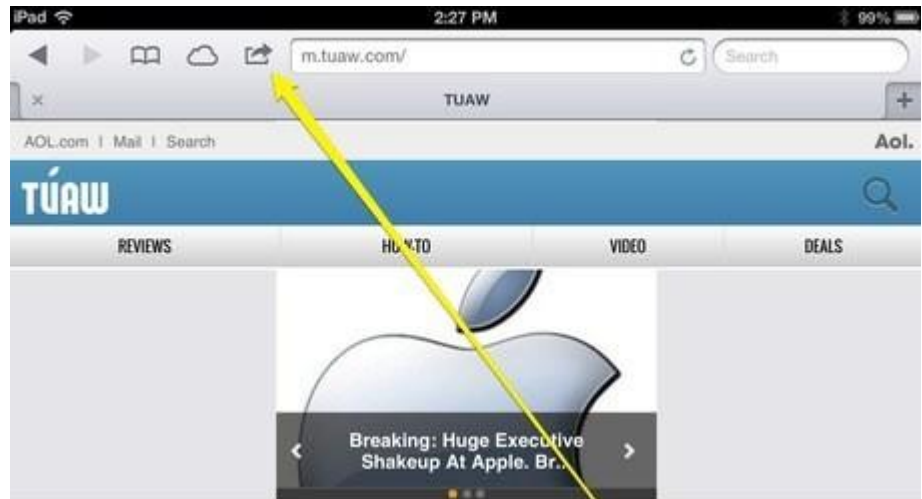


Offline and Uncluttered Reading on the iPad

If you are having your students do research using the Safari browser on an iPad, you may be worried about all of the clutter on some of the pages that they are visiting. With a tool included in the free iOS 6 update, you can remove that clutter and help to keep them focused on the learning. The tool removes distractions like ads, site navigation, address bar, etc. The result looks a lot like an article in PDF format.

The Reader Button

Open the Safari app and type in the URL of the website that they will be using. Once the site has loaded, tap the "Reader" button in the address bar across the top. This will automatically remove all of the clutter so that all that remains is the article.



Add to Reading List

Not enough time to finish reading? Add the article's link to the Reading List and finish it later by tapping the "Actions" button (the one to the left of the address bar). Then tap "Add to Reading List." Safari will now save the web page in the Reading List so that they can read it later, even when they don't have any Internet connectivity.
